Machine Quilting Sampler



Materials

We suggest that you purchase 100 percent cotton fabric in a solid color, batik or muslin to make this sampler. To see your stitches better, choose a dark fabric and light-color thread. Consult the video for more fabric, thread and batting suggestions.

- 2 yards cotton solid*
- 1 yard batting*
- 50–60-wt. quilting thread*
- Basic sewing tools and supplies

Essential Machine-Quilting Tools

Below is a list of essential machine-quilting tools that you will need, besides your sewing machine, to machine quilt with success.

- Walking or even-feed sewing machine foot*
- Open-toe embroidery or free-motion quilting foot*
- 80/12 sewing machine needles*
- Water-soluble or heat-erasable fabric markers**
- Quilter's grip gloves
- Teflon mat**
- Spray starch
- Blue painter's masking tape
- Pencil and paper
- Nickel-plated quilting basting pins
