MATERIALS LIST

Handbag Style A

Materials

Materials listed are for one large OR medium size handbag.

- Coordinating fabrics:*
 - ½ yard (or 2 fat quarters) Fabric 1
 - ½ yard (or 2 fat quarters) Fabrics 2, 3 and 4
 - ¼ yard (or 1 fat quarter) Fabric 5
- Coordinating all-purpose thread
- 1 yard fusible fleece interfacing*
- ½ yard thin heavy-weight fusible interfacing*
- ⅛ yard ultra firm heavy-weight fusible interfacing*
- 1 magnetic purse snap or 1 (1⅜-inch) large shank button
- 2 large flat pocket buttons (optional)
- Basic sewing supplies and equipment

Materials

Materials listed are for one large OR medium size handbag.

- Coordinating fabrics:*
 - 8 (2½-inch by fabric width) precut strips Fabric 1
 - ½ yard (or 2 fat quarters) Fabrics 2, 3 and 4
 - ¼ yard (or 1 fat quarter) Fabric 5
- Coordinating all-purpose thread
- 1 yard fusible fleece interfacing*
- ½ yard thin heavy-weight fusible interfacing*
- ⅛ yard ultra firm heavy-weight fusible interfacing*
- 1 magnetic purse snap or 1 (1⅜-inch) large shank button
- 2 large flat pocket buttons (optional)
- Basic sewing supplies and equipment
